Describe present and historic physical appearance.

This 1.1 mile (1.8 km) section of Rural Route 66 is used today as a local access road. It is paved with asphalt, except for the east end, which is cindered. It has a standard concrete box culvert. The pavement has been in place since this section was a part of Route 66. Aside from slight deterioration of the road surface, it has changed little in appearance since the historic period.

This section of road was built in 1932-33 as part of Arizona Forest Highway Project 4C, a realignment of the road built in 1922. It covered most of the original alignment. The 20' wide travelway had bituminous surfacing which was eventually asphalted. In 1950, a realignment up Ash Fork Hill bypassed this section, but local access to Pine Springs Ranch was maintained. In 1966, it was abandoned to the Kaibab National Forest, the original land owner. The Forest Service requested that the Arizona Highway Department fulfill its right-of-way permit obligations to remove all structures and improvements and restore the site to its natural appearance. Kaibab National Forest Supervisor Jack H. Prevey requested that the Highway Department " . . . have this old highway ripped up, the concrete culvert ends demolished, and the entire area revegetated. . . . We don't [want to] have a strip of asphalt across the National Forest which is of no functional purpose." (KNF file 2730). The roadway east and west of Pine Springs Ranch was obliterated, leaving this 1.1 mile section intact.

Pine Springs Ranch, which dates from the historic period, is still located on the south side of the road. Although not a part of this nomination, the ranch enhances the historic setting.

Verbal Boundary Description

This 1.1 mile (1.8 km) long section of Rural Route 66 is in the vicinity of Pine Springs Ranch. The west end is defined by an obliterated section of Route 66, while the east end is defined by an abandoned section of Route 66 (see above UTM references). The sides are defined by the original right-of-way, 66 feet to each side of the centerline. The ROW is defined by standard concrete markers. See attached map.


